### **Report for 2022-23**

Sangita is a happy girl and loves to attend school. She is very regular in her attendance. She is neat and clean in everything she does, is able to do her daily chores independently and is completely toilet trained. She is able to sit and finish her meals and cleans her plate by herself. She is friendly with everyone. During meditation, she sits quietly and chants her mantras in a clear voice.

#### ***LANGUAGE (Hindi)***



In her Hindi class, Sangita is attentive and sits properly. She sings all the songs in a soft and low voice and her favourite songs are “Titili Rani” and “Tiki Maina”. She does take a little time to memorise the songs but

eventually is able to do so and sings with the class. She listens very attentively to all the stories in the storytelling sessions and can give answers if she is asked any questions. But if she has to reproduce the story and narrate it in her own words, she faces difficulties and feels shy. Where her language development is concerned, she has started taking part in the plays and dramas. She takes time to memorise the dialogues and has to take help in pronouncing some of the difficult words. She participated in the play enacted on Janmashtami where she played the role of the narrator.



## **MATHEMATICS**



Although Sangita listens very attentively in class, she takes time to learn. She rarely misses a class. She tries her best to follow what didi teaches and if she cannot understand any concept, then she asks. She has difficulty in following didi due to language problem. In colour recognition, she learnt very fast and made beautiful patterns with rangometry. She can do forward counting from 1 to 100 and backward counting till 20. She took a long time in learning the numbers and counting.



### ***LANGUAGE (English)***

Sangita has learnt many poems and likes to recite them in a soft voice with actions. She likes “Chai Chai Coffee Coffee” the most. She has also learnt the poem, “Old McDonald had a Farm”. She likes to listen to stories and the stories with animals interest her the most. She likes to make the sound of animals. She sits very quietly during storytelling time and listens to all the stories very attentively. She participated in a play called “The Enormous Turnip” in the assembly. She





performed the role of an old lady very beautifully. She really enjoyed a lot doing the play. She learnt her dialogues very fast.
