Introduction



Vaidehi is a cute and sweet girl. She loves interacting with everyone at school. Her best friend is Puja, and she enjoys talking and sharing things with her. Pink is her favourite colour because it looks cool and beautiful. She loves dancing to songs

played on the radio, like "Maya Yoshada" and others. She comes from a distant village. Her mother visit her a couple of times every few months. She has two members in her family—her mother and herself. As she is the only child in her family, she is loved by all her relatives.



Hostel Accommodation

Vaidehi loves staying in the hostel as she gets to interact with many friends. She can do her homework and study at night after dinner in the hostel, which she wouldn't be able to do at home. She feels more comfortable staying in the hostel.

Health and Hygiene

Vaidehi takes care of herself, but sometimes older children or Bhavna di, helps her with her studies or laundry. When she comes to school, she is usually neat and clean, but on days when she looks untidy, she is told to change into new clothes. She tries to keep her cupboard clean, but she still needs to learn how to fold clothes better and keep them organized.



Self-Sufficiency

Vaidehi loves eating poori and poha for breakfast and enjoys bitter gourd. During lunch, she likes rice with kadi. Before every meal, she washes her plate, glass, and hands. She always sits with her group mates while eating. She rarely drops food, and if she does, she picks it up and throws it in the dustbin. She finishes the food on her plate and goes for seconds if she loves it again. She chews her food with her mouth closed.

Morning Rituals

Vaidehi starts her day with a prayer at school. She cleans the group area if it's dirty and then does chants and sings songs and prayers. She enjoys singing many songs and bhajans during evening prayers with her friends.

Shramdan

Every morning, Vaidehi participates in shramdan by doing *chunai* in the kitchen, separating dirt from pulses and cereals. She does this with guidance from an elder, learning how to do it properly.

ACADEMICS

English

Vaidehi shows a genuine interest in reading. She always picks up a book and tries to read on her own, which is wonderful to see. However, she has a limited understanding of phonics, leading to memorisation of words rather than developing decoding skills. However, she comprehends well when someone reads to her. When she participates in dictation activities, she struggles to connect sounds with the correct letters. Thus, her ability to write a complete word is hindered. She needs focused practise on letter formation and sound-letter correspondence to



improve her writing skills.

Hindi

Vaidehi has improved in reading, writing, and speaking. She is often interested in writing Hindi letters. She has learnt to write the varnamala and is about to finish writing the vyanjan. She can revise her dialogue nicely and has remembered the names of the days in Hindi. They are also



learning the names of the months in Hindi. She can recite the poem "Jhansi Ki Rani" by heart. On Janmashtami, she became the narrator in the drama. She has remembered the days and months in Hindi, and they are now learning counting.

Math

Vaidehi shows significant progress in maths. She has made considerable improvement and is working hard to catch up with her peers. She learns best through experiential methods.

Vaidehi can now write numbers from one to one thousand. She clearly understands the hundreds, tens, and unit's places and can represent three-digit numbers using cards. However, she finds it challenging to write numbers in both expanded and short form and needs cards to assist her. Initially, she requires reminders to check each digit's place when arranging numbers in ascending and descending order. She has demonstrated significant improvement in written carryover addition.

In multiplication, she actively participates in group discussions but takes time to find the correct answers. She understands the concept and can



describe the meaning of multiplication questions using objects (e.g., "3 multiplied by 4 means we are taking 3 times 4").

When creating word problems, she often confuses addition and subtraction, typically making subtraction questions even when asked for addition. To help clarify her confusion, we encourage her to formulate the questions in Hindi first and then translate them into English. However, she can successfully create multiplication word problems.

Overall, Vaidehi is a motivated student with a few areas for improvement. Continued support and monitoring will enhance her focus and participation.



Project



Vaidehi participates actively in class activities and demonstrates a willingness to engage with the material.

Despite her quiet nature, she puts effort into her learning journey. Over the past few months, she has

explored the following topics with enthusiasm:

Water: Vaidehi's excitement was evident as she explored the uses and sources of water. Her numerous drawings depicted various water-related aspects. She understood the water cycle.

Occupation: Vaidehi enjoyed learning about the people who help us in emergencies. She engaged with a song about occupations and learnt about special individuals who perform important jobs. Vaidehi participated in a role play as a painter, enjoying the role and understanding the importance of painters. She also created pictures of the painter's tools.



Solar System: Vaidehi expressed great joy in learning about the solar system. Through the song "Solar System," she gained information and understanding about the planets. She created a drawing of the solar system and made a model of Jupiter using wastepaper, balloons, and glue. To enhance

her knowledge, she watched videos and consulted books for more interesting facts.

Our Teeth: Vaidehi learnt about the names and types of teeth, including molars, premolars, canines, and milk teeth. She created drawings of the teeth and labelled them. When asked questions, she made an effort to respond in complete sentences.



Our Eye: Vaidehi learnt about the eye and its importance. She explored the different parts of the eye and made a labelled drawing, which she displayed on the board. She enjoyed this topic and demonstrated her understanding by accurately naming the parts.

Insects: The insect's topic was particularly exciting for her. On the first day of class, she explored her surroundings and observed a variety of insects. She held some insects in her hand without fear and shared her findings with the class. Vaidehi created drawings of her favourite insects and wrote a poem about a moth:



*"My name is Moth,
I love to stick to cloth.
Mostly I come out at night,
And try to fly like a kite.
I love to keep my wings flat while I am resting,
I love to land where the light is bright."*

Air: Vaidehi learnt new facts about air, which were completely new to her. She prepared for a science exhibition on August 13th for Chacha Ji's birthday, choosing the experiment "Air has Pressure." With the help of thread, a balloon, and a straw, she demonstrated and explained her experiment alongside her partner, Puja.



Safety: Vaidehi learnt how to provide first aid in emergencies when medical help is not available. She understood how to treat injuries such as cuts and bleeding. Vaidehi enjoyed listening to stories about fractures, choking, catching fire, and electric shocks.

Plants: The plants topic was exciting for her. Vaidehi explored the garden to observe various types of plants and learnt about fungi, parasites, lichens, ferns, etc. Vaidehi enjoyed walking around the garden with her classmates and teachers. She drew pictures of how plants benefit us, including "plants give us oil" from sources like coconut, karanj, and sunflower. She also learnt about the parts of plants and their importance, which further sparked her interest.





dancing and concentrates well in class. Although she sometimes has difficulty learning steps quickly, she

takes her time to master them. Currently, she is learning a dance to a song from Tamil Nadu, which she enjoys as it is a Bharatanatyam dance.

Vaidehi enjoys puzzles because she believes they help her mind develop. Her favourite is the Cinderella puzzle, and she can complete 50-piece puzzles. She prefers working alone but needs to focus more in class to improve her concentration. She is regular but not always on time.
