In the afternoon, we explored Buddha Monastery, Buddha Park, and War Memorial before retiring for the night. The next day, we returned to Rupa, where we bonded with the monks through activities like football and dancing. In the morning in Rupa, we enjoyed breakfast consisting of eggs and milk. Our visit also included exploring a Kiwi orchard and tasting kiwis. Subsequently, we journeyed to Kaziranga, where we spent a night and embarked on a thrilling jeep safari in Kaziranga National Park, sighting elephants, rhinos, and wild buffaloes.



Continuing our adventure, we proceeded to Shillong, Meghalaya, amidst rain. During our stay, we visited Elephant Falls, Seven Sister Falls, Mawsamai Cave, and Umium Lake. Despite the dried-up water at Seven Sister Falls, I found Mawsamai Cave particularly intriguing as it was my first experience exploring a cave. From there, we travelled to Guwahati and then Gangtok, where we arrived at midnight. The following day in Gangtok, we visited Ganesh Top, a viewpoint of Gangtok, and Ban Jhakri Falls, where I enjoyed the refreshing waters. In the afternoon, we indulged in shopping at Sikkim Bazaar. On November 12th, we visited Baba Mandir and a lake, followed by a trip to Char Dham and Namchi the next day. Upon returning, we celebrated Diwali, exchanging cultural dances with the locals. On November 14th, Children's Day, we began our journey back to Kolkata, where we explored Science City, Victoria Memorial, and Sri Aurobindo Bhawan. Among these, Science City left a lasting impression with its exhibits on human evolution and a fascinating journey through time and space. Finally, we returned to Kechla, concluding our memorable journey through the Northeast. I am immensely grateful to Tara didi for organizing this enriching experience, which expanded our horizons beyond imagination.
