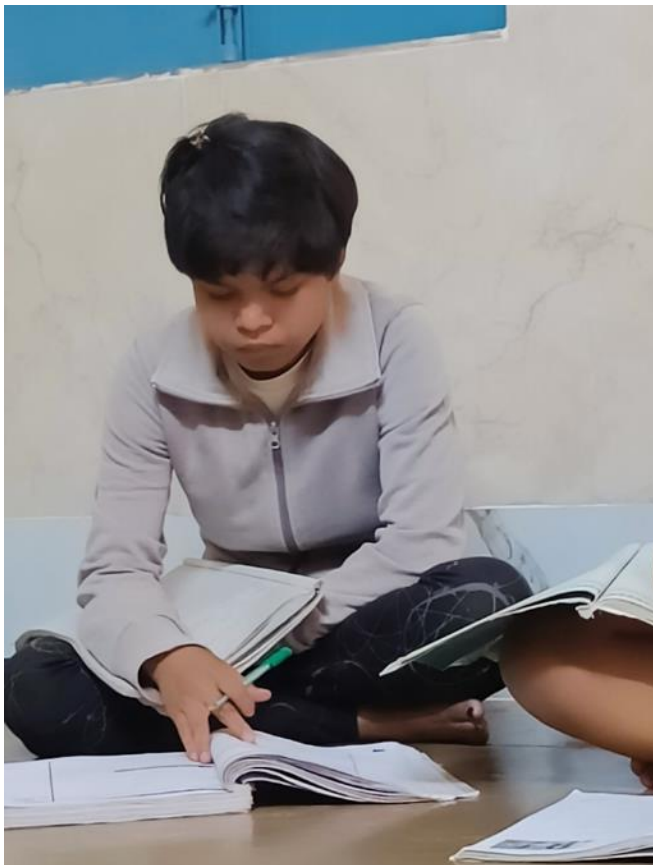
## Academic Progress
