She collected the basic information about Tamil Nadu from the books and jotted it down in her notebook. She then proceeded to prepare her little speech that she was going to give. She spoke with a little hesitation but did give her best. She has now learnt about the union territories and states and their capitals, about the different continents and oceans and also about her own country.

Science

Jigyasa is a very energetic and lively child. She loves studying science and has shown great progress. She has finished Class 4 of Living Science with good results and is now studying Class 5. She needs to spend more time understanding this subject. While she asks many questions, she sometimes forgets which class she is in and asks questions not pertaining to the subject. She has created charts, such as how electricity is produced from wind. She faces difficulties in relating to and applying concepts in physics, particularly in the chapter on forces and water. During experiments, she learns many things, such as wind energy and solar energy, which she believes can help her in daily

interested in making charts and conducting practical experiments. She has nearly completed two or three chapters of Class 4, which cover topics about the birth of birds, their eggs, trees,
