Report for 2023-24 (Second Term)

Mathematics- Ranjeet is an intelligent boy. He is able to learn the concepts quite fast. But he is lagging behind as he has been absent for long periods due to his health issues. He is also not staying in the hostel. He is attending only one class in the morning in which new concepts are taught. He is able to learn them and do the question answers given in the class. He is unable to solve questions from the book and is therefore unable to cover up. He is doing class 3 book of Mathematics. He has been able to cover only 6 chapters in the last one year. These 6 chapters are Numbers, Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, Division and Fractions. He is quite clear in most of these chapters but needs revision in some of them. He can read numbers up to the thousands very



confidently. He is quite clear with the terms 'successor' and 'predecessor'. He is able to compare numbers using symbols of $<$, $>$ and $=$ but takes little time to arrange numbers in ascending and descending order. He needs clarity in odd and even numbers and more practise in Roman numerals. Ranjeet is able to add numbers up to 4-digits by carrying over

quite easily. He needs revision in rounding numbers. He is able to understand the questions and the word problems of addition and solve them. He is also able to subtract numbers by borrowing but needs more practice. He was able to solve the questions of multiplication and division when he was regular to school. But he needs revision in these chapters and needs to learn the multiplication table again. He also needs to increase his calculation speed as he has slowed down due to his being absent for classes. In the group, he learnt Fractions. He took time to understand the concepts but managed to catch up with the others. He needs clarity in most of the concepts in fractions. If he becomes regular to school and is given special attention in the class, he'll be able to revise and



clear his doubts and therefore will be able to move ahead easily along with the others.

Projects- Ranjeet is a very sharp child who grasps concepts quickly and demonstrates a good understanding of the material taught in class. However, he faces the challenge of irregular attendance, having missed approximately 10-15 classes due to medical tests and diagnoses. Despite this, Ranjeet shows enthusiasm for learning and enjoys what he does. He is fortunate to have supportive friends who encourage and assist him whenever he encounters difficulties. While Ranjeet is self-reliant, he requires assistance from teachers,

particularly with concepts, sentence construction, and spelling in his writing. With continued support and guidance, Ranjeet has the potential to excel academically.

Ranjeet has been doing well in his project class and is able to understand the concepts. He has a good understanding of this topic and is able to answer questions. In the topic of flowers, he drew a drawing of a part of a flower and remembered all the parts of the flower without worry. He did lots of reading and writing about the concepts of flowers. He has remembered the significance of many flowers and their role in our environment. In this topic, he adopted a plant and took care of it. He has good concentration power and learns very quietly during group discussions. His favourite flower is

attentive participation, embodying respectful conduct throughout.

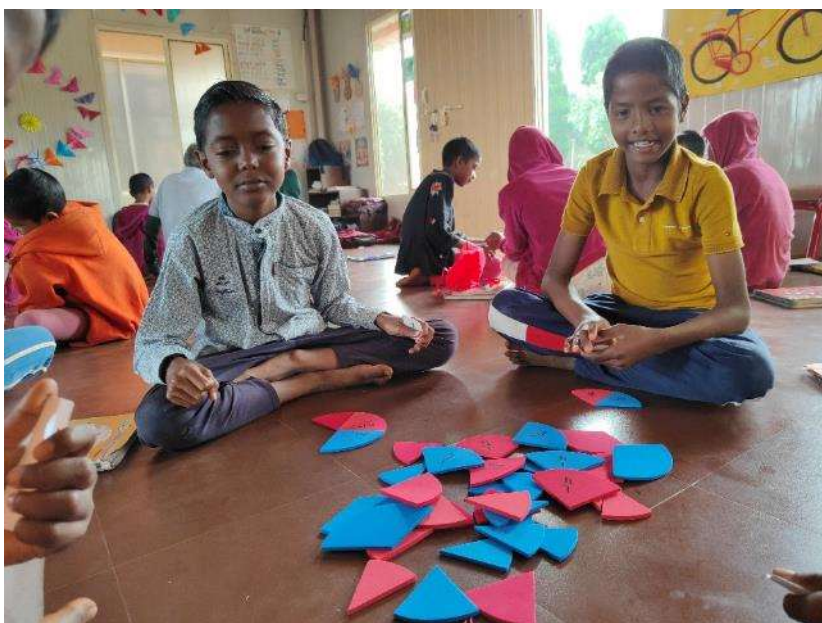
