Introduction:

English:

Khushi excels at creating her own stories and drawings. She has learnt all 26 alphabets, their sounds, and the difference between big and small letters. Khushi can read

two and three-letter words, simple sentences, and write her name in English.

Hindi:

While she is generally quiet in class, she possesses a playful side and tends to engage with whatever is at hand. Nonetheless, she maintains full attention during class. She has also learned several songs like "Lehra Do" and "Meri Rakhi Ki Dor," as well as poems like "Chi Chi Chidiyan" and "Samay Bada Anmol." However, she may take a bit more time to learn the lines. Pronunciation challenges arise with certain letters, specifically "CHA," "JHA," "SHA," and "KHA."

Projects:





Khushi exhibited a keen interest in learning across various topics, as described in the following areas:

Plants and Leaves: In the Plants and Leaves topic, Khushi initially had some difficulty answering questions about the importance of plants. However, as she delved deeper into the subject, she developed a clear understanding of different plant types, leaves, flowers, and their significance. She demonstrates a strong ability to recognize numbers from 1 to 1000 using the ganit mala. She also understands the concept of the greatest and smallest numbers with one, two, and three digits. Khushi is capable of writing numbers in expanded form. Initially, she



required the assistance of number cards to avoid confusion, but she has since gained



confidence in this skill. In addition, Khushi has made substantial progress in performing addition with carrying over. She can successfully add three-digit numbers with other three-digit numbers, showing a strong grasp of this concept. While Khushi initially had some challenges understanding subtraction by borrowing, she was given special attention and support to catch up with her peers. As a result, she now demonstrates clarity and proficiency in this area. Khushi is capable of comparing numbers using the symbols >, <, and =. While she may take some extra time, she can also arrange numbers in ascending and descending order. Khushi's ability to form numbers using three different digits highlights her aptitude for mathematical concepts. Additionally, she has learned

how to use the abacus, although there is room for improvement in quickly and accurately representing numbers with this tool. Khushi exhibits potential in mathematics and has made progress in various areas. Continued practise and consistency will enable her to further enhance her mathematical skills and develop confidence in her abilities.

Arts:

Khushi enthusiastically engages in all art class activities and focuses on maintaining concentration while working. Although she takes her time, she ensures her

work is neat and clean. Her





paper folding is precise, and she particularly enjoys adding colour to her creations.
