ACADEMICS

ENGLISH

Sheela has recently commenced attending school regularly after persistent efforts to motivate her to enjoy school. Although she has begun speaking in English during class sessions, she still requires significant improvement in this area. She particularly enjoys listening to stories narrated by teachers and actively participates in enacting plays, often donning costumes for the performances. She actively contributed to the creation of the story 'Poldy's Travel' alongside her peers, demonstrating a keen interest in crafting a beautiful book based on the story. With the initiation of her reading journey, Sheela is able to read three-letter words and can construct such words with assistance and guidance. Repetition of words aids her in forming them, and with consistent exposure, she gradually improves. She exhibits clarity in identifying consonant sounds, except for certain letters like W, V, Y, Q, and U, where she occasionally experiences confusion.

HINDI

Sheela exhibits commendable behaviour in the classroom and has made noticeable progress in her Hindi studies. While she requires improvement in both speaking and pronunciation, her dedication to learning is evident. She enjoys listening to stories, particularly those featuring rabbits, and actively engages in creating her own narratives. Sheela shows interest in watching movies, particularly those depicting gods and goddesses, although comprehension may pose a challenge for her. In the play "Suraj ki Pariya," she portrayed the role of a cloud, facing some difficulty in memorizing lines but demonstrating effort and participation nonetheless.



MATH



Sheela is present in the class on time every day. Whenever something new is taught to her in the class, she sits very quietly and listens to the teacher, but she takes time to learn. Now she is learning to write three-digit numbers up to five hundred; she takes time to write the numbers since her handwriting is very slow, but she is trying her best to improve her handwriting and her writing speed. She has learned ascending and descending order, after and before numbers, between numbers, and comparison of numbers. She enjoys doing comparison of numbers and before and after numbers and finds it easy. Ascending and descending are a bit tough for her, and it takes a lot of time to

arrange mixed numbers in ascending or descending order.

PROJECT

Sheela, despite being generally quiet, displayed increased participation and engagement during the past four topics covered:

HUMAN BODY PARTS
